

MY MONTHLY MIDDLE GRADE RECOMMENDATION



READING FOR PLEASURE \sim NON- FICTION RESEARCH

- The Literacy Trust 2022 commissioned a report into children's non-fiction reading had some interesting findings.
- The Non-fiction reading is popular regardless of gender and socio-economic background. A similar percentage of boys and girls (54.5% vs. 56.7%) and children who did and didn't receive free school meals (54.1% vs. 55.7%) said they read non-fiction in their free time.
- Overall, this report found that more children and young people who read non-fiction were motivated to read for educational purposes, to satisfy curiosities, to foster social connections and to support their mental wellbeing. At the same time, we found a clear link between non-fiction reading and environmental awareness and action. This included reading and writing about the environment in their free time, emphasising the important role of literacy and non-fiction reading in helping children and young people engage with their interests and with the world around them.

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
NON-FICTION NOVEMBER








5 easy to implement ideas for Non-Fiction November

- 1. Create non-fiction reading rivers ~ this could be whole class or individual. Children (and the teachers) look at all their reading through the day and record it on the river. See how much we read for information through the day.
- 2. Pass the Parcel ~ There's a couple of ways to do this: a) have clues to/facts from the central book in each layer.
 - b) Place a different non-fiction book cover into each layer to discuss.
 - c) Place a question in each layer for that child to find the answer to in a book.
- 3. Make a whole school fab fact wall.
- 4. Instructions ~ have a class bake off following instructions to make tasty treats. Enjoy them in the library and invite parents in to read and share books.


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EMPATHY ACTION MONTH
